Questions:

1. In Review, describe what will happen from verses 1-5.

2. What day is being spoken of in 6-7 and how does it relate to what was said earlier? (See Isaiah 13:9-13, Isaiah 24:17-23, Joel 2:30-32, Acts 2:20, Matthew 24:29-30)

3. How is that day explained in 7? What will happen in the evening?

4. What does verse 8 say will come about?

5. How might the following help us understand verse 8?
 - a. Ezekiel 47:1-12 (When do you think Ezekiel 40-48 takes place?)

 - b. Joel 3:18

 - c. Jeremiah 17:13

6. Who rules over the earth presently? (See 2 Cor. 4:4, John 12:31, Eph. 2:2).

7. What does verse 9a say?

8. How do the following relate to what was said in verse 9?

11. From 11, describe what will happen in the day in which the Lord is king alone and the land is changed? (See Zech. 6:13, 8:3-6, Jer. 23:5-6, Ezek. 34:25-31, Amos 9:13-15)
12. Make observations concerning what will happen during this time (i.e. the Millennial reign of Christ on earth).

 - b. Isaiah Ch. 35
 - c. Isaiah 65:19-25
13. Although we are not Israel, how should we respond to what we have seen in Zech. 14 so far? How should we respond to what the Lord has promised for us? (See 2Tim. 2:12, Rev 5:9-10, Rom 8:16-18, 31-32, 1Thes. 4:17-18, Rev 21-22)
